About the project:

- 2 year project to address the needs of people affected by forced migration in Serbia towards self determined futures and quality of life.
- Funded by the European Commission, the Balkan Trust for Democracy and The ERSTE Foundation and managed by the CDRSEE, in partnership with the Novi Sad Humanitarian Center and the Center for Peace and Democracy Development
- Direct, immediate support to 5721 families affected by forced migration, through 10 help desks in 9 locations in Serbia in 2007 and 2008
- Thorough demographic and economic research and application of the research into practical models.
- Training activities based on latest research results will empower the vulnerable group to engage into planning a sustainable livelihood based on their own ideas

Facts and Figures:

- A total of 379,135 refugees were registered during the 2002 census in Serbia – 192,672 (50.8%) in Central Serbia and 186,463 (49.2%) in Vojvodina. According to UNHCR data, 206,000 Kosovo IDPs lived in Serbia in 2002.
- Between 40-50% of refugees and IDPs in Serbia live below the poverty line.
- Unemployment rates of refugees and IDPs exceed those of the domestic population.
- Critical success factors for sustainable income generation for migrants include: knowledge of foreign languages and possession of modern skills, awareness of employment support programmes run by NES, Local Governments and NGOs as well as entrepreneurial attitude
- Promising occupations and branches have been identified as: personal services, b2b services, food processing, tourism, construction as well as electrical and mechanical engineering.
- Useful support can be given in the field of promoting registration of grey economy businesses, effective training in transferable skills, active job searching tactics and entrepreneurship, as well as raising the awareness for the utmost importance of education and lifelong learning for full inclusion in modern societies
- Training activities have already started and by April 2009 an approximate number of 1000 beneficiaries will have been trained. Locations: Beograd, Dobanovci, Kragujevac, Kraljevo, Niš, Novi Sad, Šid, Subotica, Valjevo, Vršac. Training courses offered: Life skills, basic and advanced IT training (ECDL certified), web design, accounting (EBCL certified), administration, entrepreneurship (EBCL certified), mushroom farming. A volume of 8 Training Manuals has been compiled for the training activities.
